Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2015-09-11 to be valid from 2015-09-11, spring semester 2016.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Language of instruction: English

Main field of studies

English

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- provide a basic account of important parameters for the efficient learning of words and phrases in a foreign language

Competence and skills

- use a considerable vocabulary of general English words and phrases, partly receptively and partly productively in correct speech and writing
- discuss relatively advanced Anglophone fiction and non-fiction in spoken and written English using appropriate vocabulary
- with the use of aids produce simple academic texts in English with a clear structure, correct paragraphing and correct language

- read, discuss and analyse modern English texts of a general character

Judgement and approach

- identify and discuss the implicit and explicit statements about class, gender and ethnicity in texts at a basic level

Course content

The course makes up the second half of English Level 1, so students who have completed both English Level 1a (1-15 credits) and English Level 1b (16-30 credits) are qualified to move on to English Level 2.

The course continues to enable students to practise their ability to read and understand English texts and to express themselves in speech and writing in correct and polished English. Literature from different parts of the Anglophone world is studied and analysed with regard to both language and content. The students practise writing short texts of a general character. Supported by lectures and seminars at the start of the course, students practise efficient word and phrase learning throughout the course. The learning process is mainly in the form of independent study but is supported by some teaching during the course. The students are also trained in planning their work och adapting to predetermined time frames.

The course consists of the following modules:

1. Written Language Proficiency, 5 credits,
2. Literature, 6 credits,
3. Vocabulary, 4 credits.

Course design

The teaching consists of group work, lectures, seminars, workshops and teaching via a teaching platform.

Assessment

The course is assessed on the basis of

Module 1 Written Language Proficiency: Compulsory exercises and an independent, academic paper

Module 2 Literature: Continuous assessment of written and oral presentations, and of activity at the seminars, and a written exam

Module 3 Vocabulary: Written final exam and intermediate exams (the students are expected to complete at least 3 of the 4 intermediate exams)

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a grade Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all modules. To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must also have been awarded this grade on at least 10 credits.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed ENGH01, English: Level 1a, 15 credits, or the equivalent.

Further information

1. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
2. The modules are identical to three of the modules in English: Level 1, 30 credits. This is a part-time (50%) course that is taught throughout the semester and together with the students on the course English: Level 1, 30 credits.
