# Details of approval

# **General Information**

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

# Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

#### Knowledge and understanding

 provide a specialised account of a chosen area of study in English linguistics or literature

### Competence and skills

- execute a literary analysis with the correct use of relevant literary terms, or (depending on their specialisation) be able to execute a study of language data using the terms and methods applied in linguistics
- independently identify, formulate and solve research issues in linguistics or literature
- organise their time so that tasks are completed within predetermined time frames
- independently search for and use information gained from libraries or databases concerning English literature or linguistics
- discuss and present their research and that of others in a manner that is adapted to the relevant audience and situation
- express themselves in writing in idiomatically correct academic English
- apply the correct reference and citation conventions as used in scholarly texts in literary studies or linguistics

### Judgement and approach

- critically review and assess different types of sources
- discuss the role of the English language in society and the responsibility of individuals and organisations for how it is used

## Course content

The student will already have chosen a linguistic or literary specialisation for their studies. The knowledge and skills acquired on previous courses are to be applied in a degree project in which the student reinforces his/her ability to use correct spoken and written English.

## Course design

The teaching consists of seminars and individual supervision of the degree project. The supervision is limited to the semester in which the student first registered on the course, unless there are special reasons to the contrary. Attendance is compulsory at the defence seminar.

### Assessment

The assessment is based on

an individual degree project presented in the form of an academic paper. The degree project is to be discussed and defended at a final seminar. This seminar is part of the assessment of the degree project.

Passed degree projects at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for uploading the passed degree project as a PDF file in LUP student papers.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

# Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on the degree project. To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must must have been awarded this grade on the degree project.

## Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed ENGH05 or the equivalent.
