## **ENGM17, English: Corpus Linguistics - Tools, Methods and Analysis, 7.5 credits**

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### **Details of approval**

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2020-03-12 to be valid from 2020-03-12, autumn semester 2020.

### **General Information**

This course is offered as a freestanding course and can be included in a first or second cycle degree.

### **Learning outcomes**

On the completion of the course, the student shall:

#### **Knowledge and understanding**

- be able to discuss the basic assumptions of Corpus Linguistics
- be able to account for key issues and more sophisticated concepts in Corpus Linguistics
- be able to formulate relevant research questions based on the course literature
- be able to account for and assess ethical issues related to corpus compilation, use and dissemination

### **Competence and skills**

- be able to search and use relevant corpora according to the nature of a given research assignment
- be able to use corpus linguistic methods and tools to perform linguistic analyses of written and spoken data
- be able to set the requirements for the compilation of a corpus and the annotation criteria to carry out an individual research assignment
- be able to critically assess research articles with regard to hypothesis, methodology, descriptive adequacy, internal consistency and explanatory value

### **Judgement and approach**

- be able to make metatheoretical reflections on his or her own research
- be able to make methodological decisions according to the nature of a given research task
- be able to assess different theoretical and methodological perspectives in the light of how well they can address specific corpus linguistic tasks

### **Course content**

This course is an introduction to the rapidly growing field of Corpus Linguistics. Corpus Linguistics (CL) is a method to retrieve data to study natural occurring language in different contexts. Retrieval of data is usually carried out with the aid of different types of software. Corpora are machine-readable collections of texts compiled to explore how language is used in real communication, written or spoken. The course combines theoretical insights relating to relevant research questions, criteria and methods for evaluating, building and annotating corpora with exploratory hands-on language lab sessions using tools that have been developed for searching and organizing the data as well as well methods for corpus building and annotation. The main aim is to familiarize the student with how to master the use of language corpora for different purposes in linguistic research.

### **Course design**

Teaching consists of lectures, seminars, individual and group exercises. The course includes 1-2 obligatory oral presentations of group projects.

### **Assessment**

The course is examined through an individual written assignment.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

## **Grades**

To be admitted to the course, students must have at least 90 credits and a completed Bachelor's degree, or the equivalent, in a language or in general linguistics.
