Details of approval

The syllabus is an old version, approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2013-11-04 and was valid from 2013-11-04, spring semester 2014.

General Information

Subject: English

The course is offered as a freestanding course for students requiring 120 credits to be admitted to top-up teacher training (KPU).

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Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to account for key issues and concepts in English linguistics,
- be able to account in depth for the areas of linguistics chosen for specialised study,

Competence and skills

- be able to independently formulate relevant research questions based on the required reading,
- be able to discuss linguistic issues in speech and writing, using appropriate terminology and sophisticated theoretical approaches,
- be able to summarise and describe in depth selected areas of English linguistics in both speech and writing,

Judgement and approach

- be able to distinguish between valid and invalid scientific arguments,
- be able to, informed by linguistic and scientific approaches, critically assess information and sources,
- be able to discuss language and linguistics in relation to wider society, addressing ethnicity, gender and class among other phenomena.

Course content

The course is intended for students with 90 credits in English, including a Bachelor's degree project in English linguistics, who require another 30 credits in order to be qualified for top-up teacher training (KPU), preferably at the Department of Educational Sciences at Campus Helsingborg.

The idea of the course is to provide students with broadened and specialised knowledge of English and English linguistics without specifying the areas for broadened and specialised study. This means that the course leaves a lot of scope for the student to select courses in consultation with the assistant director of studies of English (or an equivalent authority).

The course includes the following modules:

1. Elective Course in English Linguistics (7.5 credits),
2. Elective Course in English Linguistics or General Linguistics (7.5 credits),
3. Linguistic Paper (15 credits). Alternatively: Elective Course in English Linguistics (15 credits). Alternatively: Two or three elective courses in English or general linguistics, one of which must deal with language acquisition (15 credits in total).

It is recommended, but not compulsory, that at least one of modules 1-3 above is concerned with language acquisition and that one module is concerned with sociolinguistics and/or language variation.

The elective courses are normally to be selected among the second-cycle courses offered at Lund University but courses in other cycles or at other higher education institutions can also be selected, subject to an agreement with the assistant director of studies of English (or an equivalent authority).

Students who choose the option Linguistic Paper in module 3 are to write about English and will conduct their studies together with students on the level 3 course in English (ENGK01 or the equivalent) specialising in linguistics. However, as the present course is in the second cycle, students are expected to produce a paper at a higher

scholarly level than that generally expected of Bachelor's degree projects.

Any elective courses in General Linguistics must be taught in English and at least to some extent address the English language.

Course design

Teaching normally takes the form of seminars and independent study, in accordance with the course syllabi of the elective courses. Distance learning may also occur, for example via a teaching platform, if the student selects appropriate courses at another higher education institution.

Assessment

1. in accordance with the relevant course syllabus
2. in accordance with the relevant course syllabus
3. Paper and critical review in conjunction with a final seminar if the students chooses Linguistic Paper (15 credits) In all other cases, in accordance with the relevant course syllabus.

Passed degree projects at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for uploading the passed degree project as a PDF file in LUP student papers.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For a grade of Pass on the whole course, students must have been awarded this grade on all modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction, students must have been awarded this grade on 22.5 credits available on the course and a grade of Pass on the remaining credits.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course students must have 90 credits in English specialising in linguistics.

Further information

1. The course is solely intended for students who plan to study top-up teacher training (KPU), normally at Campus Helsingborg.
2. The course partly replaces the discontinued course ENG164 but does not, in its present form, lead to a degree of Master (60 credits) as this degree is not

awarded at Lund University to students in English who started their studies later than 2007.

3. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
4. The course is offered at the Centre for Languages and Literature, Lund University.
