The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2007-03-30 to be valid from 2007-03-30, autumn semester 2007.

General Information

Subject: Ethnology

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at the both undergraduate and graduate levels. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- demonstrate a basic understanding of ethnological and other humanistic concepts and perspectives,
- be able to understand and explain cultural concepts in a relevant manner for various organisations, systems, structures and society in general,

Competence and skills

- be able to execute a scholarly analysis of cultural processes and be able to present his/her own research results and those of others orally and in writing,
- be able to recognise, describe and problematise various difficulties arising in multi-cultural societies deriving from matters relating to migration, cultural constructs and identification,

Judgement and approach

• demonstrate a basic ability of assessing various social phenomena from a humanist perspective.

Course content

The course provides an introduction to cultural analysis as applied in ethnology and deals with the problem of seeing oneself as a cultural being. The course focuses on the study of the multi-cultural society and issues relating to how ethnic identity is created and expressed and how cultural communication and confrontation are generated.

The course consists of the following two sub-courses:

- 1. Swedish Cultural Patterns, 7.5 credits,
- 2. Issues of Immigration and Cultural Encounters, 7.5 credits.

Course design

Teaching takes the form of lectures and tutorials. Tutorials and seminars are obligatory

Assessment

Examinations can take the following forms: oral and/or written examinations at the end of the sub-course, and curriculum-based continuous assessment in the form of assignments discussed in seminars.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a Pass on the whole course the student shall have passed all subcourses. To be awarded a grade of Distinction on the whole course the student shall have achieved the grade of Distinction for at least 15 higher education credits on the course.
