ETNK01, Ethnology: Cultural Analysis, 30 credits

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2007-03-30 to be valid from 2007-03-30, autumn semester 2007.

General Information

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at the both undergraduate and graduate levels.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to participate in the current debate on research in cultural analysis,
- demonstrate an advanced knowledge of the theories applicable to cultural analysis in ethnology,

Competence and skills

• be able to design a research programme in an autonomous manner and execute it,

• be able to acquire theoretical perspectives and methodological approaches in an autonomous manner and apply these in scholarship,

Judgement and approach

• demonstrate an understanding of the role and development of knowledge in society and the importance of research.

Course content

The course provides advanced insights into cultural analysis as pertaining to the current debates in research activities. Each student autonomously formulates a research programme on the basis of the chosen subject, and makes an inventory of previous research, and relevant theoretical and methodological studies.

The course consists of the following three sub-courses:

- 1. Cultural Analysis III, 7.5 credits,
- 2. Specialist Course, 7.5 credits,
- 3. Degree Project, 15 credits.

Course design

Teaching takes the form of lectures and tutorials. Tutorials and seminars are obligatory. The Degree Project is written individually and discussed at a seminar.

Assessment

Examinations can take the following forms: oral and/or written examinations at the end of the sub-course, and curriculum-based continuous assessment in the form of assignments, and contributions to seminars.

Passed degree projects at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for uploading the passed degree project as a PDF file in LUP student papers.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a Pass on the whole course the student shall have passed all sub-courses. To be awarded a grade of Distinction on the whole course the student shall have achieved the grade of Distinction for at least 22.5 higher education credits on the course.

Entry requirements

To be eligible for the course requires the successful completion of ETNA21, or the equivalent.
