## Details of approval

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a first or second cycle degree.

## Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

#### Knowledge and understanding

- be able to participate in the international debate on research into the humanities and social sciences,
- demonstrate in-depth knowledge of cultural theory which can be applied in analyses carried out within the field of Ethnology,

#### Competence and skills

- be able to design and present a research programme and execute it practically,
- be able to take an advanced theoretical and methodical approach and apply this to a scholarly study,

#### Judgement and approach

• demonstrate an in-depth understanding of the role and development of knowledge in society and the importance of research.

#### Course content

The course provides the students with in-depth insights into cultural and social analysis which are connected to current debates on research. Students formulate autonomously a research issue on the basis of their selected subject of specialisation, a survey of earlier research and relevant theoretical and methodological literature. The degree project, if it is produced as a thesis, is written autonomously, and defended orally at a seminar. The student is required to defend his/her own work and give formal critique of a fellow student's work.

The course consists of the following sub-courses:

- 1. International Cultural Theory, 7.5 credits,
- 2. Special Course, 7.5 credits,
- 3. Degree Project, 15 credits.

### Course design

Teaching consists of lectures and group instruction. Participation in group instruction and seminars is compulsory.

#### Assessment

Sub-courses 1 and 2 are examined through oral and/or written tests at the end of each sub-course or continuous assessment in the form of assignments and seminars. The degree project is discussed and defended at a seminar. Students are also expected to give formal critique on the project of another student.

Passed degree projects at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for uploading the passed degree project as a PDF file in LUP student papers.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

#### Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded the grade of Pass on the whole course the student shall have at least the grade of Pass on all sub-courses. To be awarded the grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course the student shall have the grade of Pass with Distinction on at least 22.5 of the credits on the course and a grade of Pass on the remaining credits.

## Entry requirements

To be eligible for the course, the student must have successfully completed ETNK01, or the equivalent.

- 1. The course replaces ETN114.
- 2. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
