### **Details of approval**

The syllabus is an old version, approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2018-02-26 and was valid from 2018-08-31, autumn semester 2018.

### **General Information**

The course is a compulsory component of the Bachelor of Arts programme in European Studies with a humanities profile. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Occasional lectures in English may be included.

### **Learning outcomes**

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

#### **Knowledge and understanding**

- identify and account for key movements, concepts and actors in the history of culture and ideas of Europe

- account for key issues of the subject of European Studies with a humanities

profile, such as identity, culture, language, nationalism, democracy and European integration

- 
- account for the development and present-day significance of the humanities in Europe

### **Competence and skills**

- discuss in speech and writing different issues within the history of culture and ideas of Europe, such as identity, culture, language, nationalism, democracy and European integration
- 
- apply an analysis based in elementary source criticism to different types of sources
- 
- use and provide a general discussion of some of the key source texts in European cultural history and history of ideas
- 
- perform subject-related information searches and master subject-related reference management

### **Judgement and approach**

- critically judge and take a position on key movements, concepts and actors in the history of culture and ideas of Europe
- 
- independently assess their knowledge and abilities in the field of European Studies with a humanities profile and identify their need of further knowledge of Europe

### **Course content**

The course provides students with an interdisciplinary introduction to the subject of European Studies with a humanities profile. On the one hand it provides an overview of the history of culture and ideas of Europe, and on the other an introduction to key issues of the area, such as identity, culture, language, nationalism, democracy and European integration. The development and historical and present-day significance of the humanities in Europe are emphasised throughout the course. The course also provides an introduction to scholarly practice, including source criticism and reference management.

### **Course design**

The teaching consists of lectures and 3-5 compulsory seminars and workshops.

In case of absence from compulsory component, students are to complete a complementary assignment in accordance with the lecturer's instructions.

## Assessment

The assessment is based on a written invigilated exam and a take-home exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

## Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, students must have been awarded this grade on both exams.

## Entry requirements
