Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2017-02-21 to be valid from 2017-02-21, autumn semester 2017.

General Information

The course is a compulsory component of the Bachelor of Arts programme in European Studies with a humanities profile. The course can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Language of instruction: Swedish Occasional lectures in English may be included.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

• identify and account for key currents, concepts and actors in European cultural history and history of ideas from Antiquity to the present

- account for continuity and change in the main development patterns of cultural history and history of ideas in Europe
- informed by perspectives of cultural history and history of ideas, account for issues of present-day relevance concerning nationalism, migration, democracy and European integration
- provide a basic account of the development and present-day significance of the humanities in Europe

Competence and skills

- discuss in speech and in writing different issues of European cultural history and history of ideas concerning, for example, nationalism, democracy, migration and European integration
- apply an analysis based in elementary source criticism to different types of sources
- use and provide a general discussion of some of the key source texts in European cultural history and history of ideas
- apply humanities perspectives within European Studies
- perform subject-related information searches, assess the information and master subject-related reference management

Judgement and approach

- critically assess and take a position on important political and cultural contexts in European history, which have been relevant for the development of a European history of ideas
- critically reflect and take a position on concepts such as gender, ethnicity and diversity from the perspective of the history of ideas

Course content

The course provides students with a general overview of European cultural history and history of ideas from Antiquity to the present. Focus is placed on issues of present-day relevance, such as nationalism, migration, democracy and European integration. The course uses a comparative perspective to deal with currents of ideas which originate in several cultural regions in Europe. In the final stage of the course, discussions focus on the relationship between the humanities and science in the European history of ideas.

The course consists of the following modules:

- 1. European History of Ideas from Antiquity to Romanticism (7.5 credits)
- 2. The Emergence of Modern and Postmodern World Views (7.5 credits)

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and seminars of which 3?5 seminars are compulsory and assessed.

Assessment

Compulsory, assessed seminars will be included (3?5).

Module 1: The assessment is based on an invigilated written exam.

Module 2: The assessment is based on a take-home exam.

Subject to an agreement with the students, other forms of examination may occur.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the students must have been awarded this grade on both modules.

Entry requirements

General requirements and studies equivalent of the courses History 1b or 1a1+1a2 and Social Studies 1b or 1a1+1a2 from Swedish Upper Secondary School.
