## **EUHA18, European Studies: Internship, 30 credits**

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### **Details of approval**

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2012-03-09 to be valid from 2012-03-09, autumn semester 2012.

### **General Information**

Subject: European Studies

The course is an optional component of the Bachelor of Arts programme in European Studies. The course can normally be included as part of a second-cycle degree.

*Language of instruction:* English and Swedish

*Main field of studies*

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*Depth of study relative to the degree requirements*

G2F, First cycle, has at least 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

### **Learning outcomes**

On completion of the course the student shall

#### **Knowledge and understanding**

- be able to demonstrate fundamental knowledge of and explain how European Studies with a humanities orientation can be used in professional life
- be able to understand and explain how knowledge of integration processes in present-day Europe can be used for solving relevant problems at a workplace
- be able to explain and provide perspectives on previous training in European Studies in a fundamental way.

### **Competence and skills**

- be able to formulate a problem of relevance for European Studies and actively select and use relevant tools to solve the problem
- be able to initiate and complete an investigation of a selected problem with a certain degree of independence
- be able to apply knowledge of the integration processes of present-day Europe to real-life situations in a workplace
- be able to analyse basic organisational problems in a workplace with the help of theoretical tools acquired in previous training in European Studies.

### **Judgement and approach**

- be able to judge and assess how skills acquired in previous humanities studies, European Studies in particular, can be used creatively in organisational and communication practice
- be able to identify the personal need for further knowledge and develop his or her skills.

### **Course content**

The course consists of a work placement at an agency, organisation or company in Europe. The student is to work full-time for at least 18 weeks on a selected problem and participate in the everyday activities at the workplace, assisted by a supervisor. The work assignment is to be connected to the previous training in European Studies.

### **Course design**

The course consists of a full-time work placement for at least 18 weeks at an agency, organisation or company in Europe.

### **Assessment**

On completion of the work placement, the student is to submit a report presenting and analysing the problem addressed by the student, the process of investigation and the experiences of the placement. In addition to the report, the supervisor is to submit a certificate stating the personal details of the student, the principal duties assigned to the student and the duration and scope of the placement. For a grade of Pass, the student must also submit an evaluation.

### **Grades**

Marking scale: Fail, Pass.

As no conventional exam is included in the examination, no other grades are awarded.

## **Entry requirements**

To be admitted to the course, students must have been admitted to the Bachelor's programme in European Studies and passed the courses EUHA11, EUHA12 and EUHA13 or acquired equivalent knowledge in some other way.

## **Further information**

1. It is the responsibility of the student to arrange a suitable work placement and finance travel, accommodation, etc. The programme coordinator must approve the work placement, the supervisor and principal duties before the placement studies can be commenced.
2. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
3. The course is offered at the Centre for Languages and Literature, Lund University.
