Details of approval

The syllabus is an old version, approved by the pro-dean for first-cycle studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2011-04-15 and was last revised on 2016-02-24. The revised syllabus applied from 2016-02-24. spring semester 2016.

General Information

The course is normally included in the Master of Arts (120 credits) programme in European Studies at the Centre for Languages and Literature but can be offered as a freestanding course subject to a special decision.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for current theories about social, political, cultural and mass media tendencies in present-day Europe
- situate an independent research-related study focusing on social, political and cultural circumstances in Europe within a wider disciplinary context
- define and use basic concepts of qualitative research within the social sciences and humanities
- identify the most suitable methods for their own research projects related to European problem areas

Competence and skills

- objectively discuss planning and implementation of a theoretically and methodologically justified research project linked to European problem areas
- critically review quantitative material in their research projects
- describe and analyse issues of research ethics
- use their knowledge of methodology to identify, describe, interpret and discuss European phenomena and issues

Judgement and approach

- demonstrate a developed analytical ability by identifying and assessing issues of theory and methodology in areas associated with Europe
- use their knowledge of theories/methods within European Studies to review and assess research texts
- plan their own continuing professional development within European Studies

Course content

Lectures and seminars present selected examples of key theories within history, cultural and social sciences, and cases of analytical applications of these theories. The course highlights theoretical approaches, research methods and considerations of research ethics that make it possible to analyse different problems in present-day Europe. The course also provides opportunities for discussions of the organisation of the studies, fieldwork and thesis work in the final semester. To ensure optimal and continuous learning of the material, the students will participate in short weekly seminars and produce written assignments based on the theme and discussion issues of the previous lecture.

The course is divided into three modules:

- 1. Theory of science overview, 5 credits,
- 2. Methodology, 5 credits,
- 3. Research design and source criticism, 5 credits.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and compulsory seminars (approximately 7).

Grades

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed EUHR11 and EUHR12 or the equivalent.
