Details of approval

The syllabus is an old version, approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2011-04-15 and was valid from 2011-04-15, autumn semester 2011.

General Information

The course is normally part of the Master of Arts programme in European Studies at the Centre for Languages and Literature but, with the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be offered as a free-standing course or included as part of a professional degree.

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Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to describe and use fundamental concepts in project management
- be able to demonstrate knowledge of how a project is to be planned, prepared, managed and implemented in professional life
- be able to identify the relevant forms of EU support for projects in culture, society and communication.

Competence and skills

- be able to identify and assess the need for resources for planning and realising a project in European culture and communication
- be able to write a project plan, utilising project management theories and methods, for a project in culture, society or communication
- be able to complete, in a group, a project plan, a funding plan and an application for funds from a relevant EU programme (e. g. the Culture programme, the MEDIA programme).

Judgement and approach

- be able to assess research and ethics issues of relevance to project management
- be able to reflect on his or her role in the group work and the group's internal dynamics
- be able to plan his or her further skills development.

Course content

The course introduces principles for project management work focusing on the forms of support available in the European Union. The course includes a theoretical overview of project management dealing with its fundamental concepts and models. Furthermore, students are offered exercises in project planning, financial planning and the writing of an application for funds required for executing a project eligible for EU support. The course also raises awareness of how the skills acquired in the European Studies programme can be used for project management. The course concludes with several group projects in which relevant theories and practical exercises are interwoven.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures, compulsory seminars and supervision of group projects.

Assessment

The forms of examination are group project work and compulsory assessed seminars.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed the courses EUHR11 and EUHR12 or have equivalent knowledge.
