Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The Board of the Department of Business Administration on 2024-02-13. The syllabus comes into effect 2024-02-13 and is valid from the autumn semester 2024.

General information

The course is aimed at individuals with academic study experience and relevant work experience. The course is particularly relevant for professionals in public or non-profit organisations who need knowledge and understanding of basic business administration. The course has a clear practical approach and studies are favoured by opportunities for immediate application of the knowledge imparted by the course.

Learning outcomes

After completing the course, the student should:

Knowledge and understanding

• Be able to show knowledge and understanding of basic theories and models in business administration.

Competence and skills

• Be able to apply basic business models and theories to public and non-profit organisations.

• Be able to present and discuss appropriated models and theories from an economic, professional and political perspective.

Judgement and approach

- Demonstrate an ability to identify and use relevant models and theories to analyse problems and develop recommendations in the context of public and non-profit organisations.
- Demonstrate an ability to present nuanced and balanced analyses and recommendations for the management and governance of public and non-profit organisations.

Course content

The course consists of two main parts. The first part covers basic economic terminology, concepts, relationships and models. The second part of the course places these in the context of public and non-profit organisations. Throughout the course, emphasis is placed on how business administration concepts and models can be understood and applied in the governance and management of public and non-profit organisations.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures, discussions and participant-led presentations. Participants are expected to contribute with examples and challenges from their respective organisations.

Assessment

The course is examined by:

- mandatory attendance and active participation in the initial teaching session of the course
- final oral examination

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Entry requirements

120 credits of university studies or equivalent, English 6
