Judgement and approach

Are ready to face changes in the field of management control and be capable of participating in change processes with a critical and mindful perspective.

Course content

The course gives a broad overview of management control systems and their interrelationships with the organisational context in which they function. The objective of the course is to provide the students with knowledge about the ongoing management control of different organisations, problems in the management control systems, and development and implementation of new management control techniques.

The following topics are covered:

- The interrelationships between management control, organizational design and strategic control
- The historical development of management control
- The Scandinavian tradition in management control
- Allocation of financial responsibility
- Transfer pricing
- Budgeting
- Financial and non-financial performance measures
- Management control in different contexts

Course design

The teaching methods include lectures, case discussions and presentations from the students.

Assessment

Examination include three cases that the students solve in groups and present both in written and oral form, and an individual final exam. There is one re-exam on the final exam.
