FIMT25, Film and Media History: Academic Skills I, 2 credits Film- och mediehistoria: Akademiska färdigheter I, 2 högskolepoäng Second Cycle / Avancerad nivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2023-03-15 to be valid from 2023-03-15, autumn semester 2023.

General Information

The course is a compulsory component of the Master of Arts (120 credits) programme in Film and Media History (HAFME). It can normally be included in a first or second-cycle degree.

Main field of studies

Film and Media History

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements A1N, Second cycle, has only first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

• give an account of the basic academic presentation forms and their contexts

Competence and skills

• in written, oral and audio-visual forms, present their own and others' research results in an accurate and accessible way, adapted to a specific context

Judgement and approach

• give basic feedback on the presentations of fellow students and receive such feedback in a constructive way

• identify their need of additional knowledge and take responsibility for their knowledge development.

Course content

The course runs in an integrated way with the semester's other courses and aims to instill progressive knowledge of the skills of the academic profession, above all related to research and research presentation.

Course design

The teaching is conducted through some short lecture components and group exercises, integrated in the other courses (FIMT21, FIMT22, FIMT23 and FIMT24).

Assessment

The regular examinations in the previous four courses are assessed based on the academic skills perspective. For a grade of Pass, this grade is required on the written assignments in the previous four courses (FIMT21, FIMT22, FIMT23 and FIMT24).

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass.

Entry requirements

Admission to the course requires a Bachelor's degree in film studies or media history or equivalent. Oral and written proficiency in English corresponding to English 6/B from Swedish upper secondary school is a requirement.
