Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2017-10-18 to be valid from 2017-10-18, spring semester 2018.

General Information

Subject: Film Studies

The course is offered as a freestanding course.

Language of instruction: English

Subject to an agreement between the lecturers and all students, all or parts of the teaching can take place in Swedish. Such an agreement would depend on everyone concerned being proficient in Swedish.

Main field of studies

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements G1N, First cycle, has only upper-secondary level entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for the development of national and European festivals and the establishment of the film festival phenomenon
- provide a general account of how film festivals and film criticism contribute to the dissemination and discussion of European film and film culture
- account for the work involved in a film festival, for the work as a critic and for other work associated with film culture

Competence and skills

- analyse how individual film festivals and critical forums function and in which contexts they are significant
- reflect on how film festivals, criticism and other film culture activities interact with institutions of society

Judgement and approach

• assess and take a position on the societal and artistic conditions of film festivals, film criticism and other film culture activities

Course content

The course presents the cultural contexts of European films and how phenomena such as film festivals, film criticism and other film culture activities in Scandinavia and Europe have interacted and characterised Scandinavian and European film.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, group work, seminars, film screenings and film discussions.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a minor paper that is also to be presented at a seminar.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.
