#### Course content

The course provides methodological and theoretical insights as well as practical exercises in terminology work for interpreters.

## Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, seminars and exercises.

#### Assessment

The assessment of the course is based on 3-4 oral or written assignments and a written take-home exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
