Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2007-03-30 to be valid from 2007-03-30, autumn semester 2007.

General Information

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at both the undergraduate and graduate levels.

Language of instruction: French and Swedish

Main field of studies

French

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements

G2F, First cycle, has at least 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to describe spoken French using the relevant terminology and compare its use by different speakers in a variety of situations,
- be able to give an account of and discuss French grammar using the relevant terminology,
- be able to give an account of vital aspects of French literature and its history and be able to discuss literature from a variety of perspectives,
- be able to discuss concepts, results and trends in his/her chosen specialist field,
- be able to evaluate information from various sources and in his/her field of specialisation be able to assess the nature and quality of that information,

Competence and skills

- be able to understand texts of substantial content and with wide variations in language use, and be able to follow and comprehend a variety of spoken French in most situations,
- be able to apply his/her knowledge of textual analysis and French grammar to the writing of precise and accurate French texts,
- be able to use a rich, varied and appropriate language in both speech and writing, where great precision and accuracy are required,

Judgement and approach

- be able to discuss the place of linguistics and literature in the academic world,
- demonstrate an ability for critical self-evaluation,
- be able to relate to a general humanist scholarly tradition.

Course content

The course places great emphasis on written and oral proficiency, and textual study and textual comprehension. The course provides a broader and deeper knowledge of French literature and language compared to the level 2 course. Two elective, advanced sub-courses complete the level 3 course. These courses are designed to provide advanced knowledge in one of the two specialist fields of study, linguistics or literature, and to strengthen language proficiency further.

The course consists of the following five sub-courses:

1. Written Proficiency, 4.5 credits,
2. Oral Proficiency, 4.5 credits,
3. Text Study, 6 credits,
4. Advanced Elective Course I, 7.5 credits,
5. Advanced Elective Course II, 7.5 credits.

Course design

Teaching may take the following forms: lectures, seminars and group work. All elements involving proficiency are obligatory.

Assessment

Examinations may take the following forms: Written and oral examinations and home assignments.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a Pass on the whole course the student shall have passed all sub-courses. To be awarded a grade of Distinction on the whole course the student shall have achieved the grade of Distinction for at least 15 higher education credits on the course.

In French sub-courses the grades 1-5 are used in which 1 is the lowest and 5 the highest grade. A grade of 1 is equivalent to Fail.

Entry requirements

To be eligible for the course requires the successful completion of FRAA02 French, Level 2, or the equivalent.

Further information

1. Sub-courses 1, 2, and 3 replace the equivalent sub-courses in FRA203. These sub-courses are also taken by students studying FRAK01, French, B.A. Degree Course, Level 3.
2. The points allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
3. The course is intended both for students who intend to join the teaching profession and for those who have other aims.
