## **FRAM04, French: Level 4 - Mag. Course, 30 credits**

*Franska: Magisterkurs, 30 högskolepoäng*

Second Cycle / Avancerad nivå

### **Details of approval**

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2007-06-18 to be valid from 2007-06-18, autumn semester 2007.

### **General Information**

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at both the undergraduate and graduate levels.

*Language of instruction:* Swedish and French

### **Learning outcomes**

On completion of the course the student shall

#### **Knowledge and understanding**

- be able to give an account of and discuss French grammar and spoken French using the relevant terminology
- be able to demonstrate a sound mastery of the linguistic theories, methods and issues in his/her specialist field of study
- be able to give an account of vital aspects of French literature and its history and be able to discuss literature from a variety of perspectives

### **Competence and skills**

- be able to understand French texts that show considerable variation in content and language use, including those from early periods, and be able to follow and comprehend spoken French of varying character in most situations
- be able to judge, compile and evaluate information from a variety of sources in the field of specialisation chosen for his/her degree thesis
- be able to use rich, varied and suitably adapted French in both speech and writing, and also in situations where great precision and accuracy are required
- be able to formulate, resolve and give an account of a research assignment in an autonomous manner, within a given time frame and by applying suitable scholarly concepts in his/her field of specialisation: French literature or linguistics

### **Judgement and approach**

- be able to discuss the place of linguistics and literature in the academic world.
- demonstrate a good ability for self-evaluation and an ability to assess the roles of cultural encounters, ethnicity and gender
- be able to relate to a general humanist educational tradition.

### **Course content**

The course provides in-depth knowledge of both contemporary and early French and French literature and an increased mastery of linguistic or literary theories, methods and issues. The course includes a degree thesis which is examined critically at a seminar. Throughout the course practice is continued in oral and written proficiency.

The course consists of the following four sub-courses:

1. Written Proficiency, 4.5 credits,
2. Oral Proficiency, 4.5 credits,
3. Text Study, 6 credits,
4. Degree Thesis, 15 credits.

### **Course design**

Teaching may take the following forms: lectures, supervision, seminars and group work.

### **Assessment**

Examinations may take the following forms: written and oral examinations and submitted assignments and a degree thesis.

Passed degree projects at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for uploading the passed degree project as a PDF file in LUP student papers.

## Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a Pass on the whole course the student shall have passed all sub-courses. To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course the student shall have achieved the grade of Pass with Distinction for at least 15 higher education credits on the course and the grade of Pass on the remainder of the course.

In French sub-courses the grades 1-5 are used in which 1 is the lowest and 5 the highest grade. A grade of 1 is equivalent to a Fail.

## Entry requirements

To be eligible for the course requires the successful completion of FRAK01 French, B.A. Degree Course, Level 3, or the equivalent.

## Further information

1. The course replaces FRA204.
2. The points allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
3. The course is intended both for students who intend to join the teaching profession and for those who have other aims.
