FYPA67, Clinical Education in Community Based Rehabilitation, 7.5 credits

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The Rehabilitation Programmes Board on 2018-04-10 and was last revised on 2020-03-18. The revised syllabus applies from 2020-03-18, spring semester 2020.

General Information

The course is included in the Bachelor's program in Physiotherapy, 180 credits, and is compulsory for a degree of Bachelor of Science in Physiotherapy. It is included in semester 6 and complies with the provisions of the Higher Education Ordinance (SFS 1993:100 with later amendments).

Language of instruction: Swedish

Main field of studies

Learning outcomes

Knowledge and understanding

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

- critically discuss physiotherapy theories in human movement science relating to patient cases
- hold a structured discussion on patient cases based on the International Classification of Functioning, Disability and Health (ICF)
- critically discuss health promotion and preventive measures related to different patient groups

- reflect on professional ethics in physiotherapy activities

Competence and skills

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

- independently apply evidence-based knowledge and adopt a critical approach to the examination, assessment, treatment, evaluation and follow up of patients with functional impairments
- use good teaching skills to motivate patients to follow instructions and prescriptions
- plan their work and document in a patient journal within predetermined time frames
- initiate and participate in health promotion measures
- independently test out, provide instruction and evaluate the use of technical aids
- confidently inform and instruct patients, family and staff with consideration given to diversity
- confidently apply a working method based on ergonomic principles
- apply rules for patient safety and hygiene
- cooperate with other professional groups in a professional manner
- confidently apply laws, statutes and rules that apply in healthcare

Judgement and approach

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

- apply a professional approach vis-à-vis patients, family, colleagues and other professionals from both an ethical and a diversity perspective
- identify and communicate their need for further knowledge and continuously develop their professional expertise

Course content

The course involves physiotherapy activities within rehabilitation at municipal organisations. It is supervised by a clinically active physiotherapist, consists of full-time study and runs for 5 weeks.

Course design

The teaching is carried out as supervised clinical training in two different areas of activity. 1.5 credits correspond to a 40-hour working week.

Assessment

For a grade of Pass on the course, students are required to have

- passed the individual written assessment criteria
- passed the individual written assignment

Attendance at the clinical training is compulsory

Number of exams

One examination and one retake is arranged soon after the course. Students who do not achieve a pass on either of these occasions will be able to retake the examination

at a later date.

Students retaking clinical training will be provided with a new opportunity for clinical training. A course being retaken is subject to the same rules as for regular clinical training.

Examination of the course may take place earlier if the student commits serious errors during clinical training because of deficient knowledge or skills. An individual plan will be drawn up for a student who fails an early examination. Any identified deficiencies are to be listed, the support available to the student is to be described and the times for examination and any re-examination of deficiencies are to be stated. Clinical training may only be resumed when the student has demonstrated that the deficiencies have been remedied.

New examiner

A student who has failed two examinations on a course or module is entitled to have another examiner appointed, unless there are special reasons to the contrary (SFS 2006: 1053). (SFS 2006:1053). The request is made to the Program director.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Marking scale: Fail, Pass.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must be admitted to the Bachelor's programme in Physiotherapy and

- have passed semesters 1, 2, 3 and 4
- and completed semester 5.
