Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2011-04-29 and was last revised on 2023-09-12 (U 2023/666). The revised syllabus comes into effect 2023-09-13 and is valid from the spring semester 2024.

General information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a general qualification for both first and second-cycle studies.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- give an account of and analyse the translated Greek texts that are addressed during the course,
- account for the basic features of classical Greek syntax,
- give an account of the role of the Greek language in the humanist tradition of learning,

Competence and skills

- read prose, epic and lyric poetry and an Attic drama in Greek using grammar and bilingual dictionaries,
- using grammar and bilingual dictionaries, translate straightforward prose from Swedish to Greek.

Judgement and approach

- identify and evaluate gender and ethnicity issues in the ancient Greek-speaking world from different points of view and in an in-depth manner,
- distinguish and evaluate the humanist tradition of learning that has been conveyed via the Greek language.

Course content

In addition to text study, the course includes a specialisation in Greek syntax and vocabulary, the characteristics of Homeric Greek and the most common metres. Translation from Swedish to Greek will be practiced to a certain level of skill.

The course consists of the following modules:

- 1. Grammar and Text Study, 15 credits,
- 2. Epic and Lyric Poetry, 7.5 credits,
- 3. The Attic Drama, 7.5 credits.

Course design

The teaching consists of: lectures and group exercises.

Assessment

Module 1 is assessed through 2 written examinations.

Module 2 is assessed through 1 oral examination.

Module 3 is assessed through 1 written assignment and 1 oral presentation.

Subject to agreement, other forms of examination may be included.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction
For the grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this
grade on all modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction, the student must have
been awarded this grade on at least module 1. For Pass with Distinction on module 1,
this grade must have been awarded on at least the second and final examination.

Entry requirements

GREA02 or the equivalent.
