General Information

Subject: History

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a first or second cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- demonstrate basic knowledge and understanding of immigration to Sweden, racism and myths of origin, discrimination against minorities and national formation in the growth of modern Sweden
- be able to discuss different ways of constructing "Swedishness" and "foreignness" in an objective manner
- be able to discuss the multi-cultural dynamic of the post-modern world

Competence and skills

- be able to search for, collect, interpret and evaluate critically information relevant to multi-culture, immigration and xenophobia
- be able to formulate and resolve simple research-related tasks, in an autonomous manner

Judgement and approach

 demonstrate insights into values which, with regard to the nature of the issues studied, are representative of the basic democratic and pluralistic value system of society and the university.

Course content

The approach taken on the course is one of an historical overview and of theoretical and critical reflection. Emphasis is placed on nationalism and national identity, immigration during various periods in history, discrimination, racism and the concept of "foreignness", as well as the current debate on multi-cultural societies. Students shall (individually or as part of a group) carry out a simple research-related assignment on a topic within the thematic framework of the course. Theoretical and methodological problems are discussed in preparation for this assignment.

The course consists of two parts:

- 1. Literature Course, 10 credits,
- 2. Written Assignment, 5 credits.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures and seminars. Sub-course 1 requires active participation in classes, and reports in the form of written assignments, oral presentations and home assignments.

Individual tutoring is provided for students in connection with the written assignment in sub-course 2.

Assessment

Examination for sub-course 1 takes the forms of continuous assessment and a final written examination, which can either be an invigilated examination or a take-home examination. Examination of sub-course 2 takes the form of a written assignment, which can be completed either individually or as part of a group. Active participation at the seminar at which the assignments are discussed also contributes to the final grade.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded the grade of Pass on the whole course the student shall have at least the grade of Pass on all sub-courses. To be awarded the grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course the student shall have the grade of Pass with Distinction on at least 10 of the credits on the course and a grade of Pass on the remaining credits.
