General Information

Subject: History

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a first or second cycle degree.

Language of instruction: Swedish

Main field of studies

History

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- demonstrate general knowledge and understanding of political, cultural, economic and social conditions and changes in the Skåne region
- demonstrate insight into historical research into the Skåne region and the theories and methods applied in such research
- be able to place developments in Skåne in a European perspective

Competence and skills

- be able to assess critically assertions made about Skåne and be able to analyse short scholarly texts on the history of Skåne
- be able to discuss various interpretations of historical problems concerning the history of Skåne
- be able to search for, sort, and evaluate critically various types of information relevant to the study of History
- be able to communicate and discuss issues concerning the various uses of history, both orally and in writing.

Course content

The course provides the students with an overview of essential historical contexts and insights into historical research, with a focus on the history of Skåne. The history of the region from the early Middle Ages to the present is dealt with through the study of political, economic, and cultural conditions and processes. This involves a problematised picture of what Skåne has been and is, and how history has been exploited in the region.

The course consists of the following sub-courses:

1. Monarchy, the Church and the Towns, 950 to 1500, 4 credits,
2. The Transition to Urbanisation, 16th and 17th centuries, 5 credits,
3. Capitalism and Late Modernism, the 18th, 19th and 20th centuries, 6 credits.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures, group exercises and seminars. Participation in the group exercises and seminars is compulsory.

Assessment

Examinations take the form of submitted written assignments and compulsory seminars.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded the grade of Pass on the whole course the student shall have at least the grade of Pass on all sub-courses. To be awarded the grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course the student shall have the grade of Pass with Distinction on at least 9 of the credits on the course and a grade of Pass on the remaining credits.
