Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2008-01-22 to be valid from 2008-01-22, autumn semester 2008.

General Information

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to give an account of the historical contexts, conditions and processes of change in a specially chosen area of study, and be able to reflect on and analyse critically complex historical problems in this area
- be able to analyse historical phenomena in a specially chosen area of study in relation to different theories and approaches
- be able to take a position on and problematise the state of research in a specially chosen area of study.

Competence and skills

- be able to execute searches for various types of information relevant to the area of study and to be able to assess critically and structure this information.

Course content

In this course, greater depth in historical studies is achieved through the close study of scholarly publications in a selected problem area. The student chooses the area of study from a list approved each term by the departmental board.

Course design

Teaching takes the form of lectures and seminars.

Assessment

Examination is by written assignments.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be eligible for the course requires 90 higher education credits in History, The History of Ideas, The History of Religions, Historical Anthropology, Central and Eastern European Studies, Gender Studies specialising in historical perspectives, Politics specialising in historical perspectives, or the equivalent.
