Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2025-05-26 (U 2025/401). The syllabus comes into effect 2025-05-26 and is valid from the spring semester 2026.

General information

The course is a compulsory component of the Master's Programme in History. The course can also be offered as a freestanding course. The course is offered as a freestanding course and can be included in a first or second-cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for the state of knowledge in a defined historical or intellectual field
- describe and problematise historical contexts, states, events and processes of change within a chosen theme

Competence and skills

- process and analyse historical or contemporary phenomena and currents of ideas based on different theories, methods and issues
- present and discuss their conclusions,
- reason about scientific problems with historical and/or ideological relevance

Judgement and approach

- relate to and discuss different directions in historical and intellectual history research and neighbouring disciplines
- take responsibility for their own knowledge development.

Course content

The course involves a thematic specialisation in a relevant area of history. Several themes are offered in parallel and students choose one of these. Each theme is studied in a small group with a focus on current research. The course aims in particular to go into depth within the chosen theme and it thus trains the students' ability to orientate themselves within a research theme. The course emphasises problem formulation, methodological and theoretical approach and creative discussion among students.

Course design

The teaching of the course is based on 2 - 4 lecturer-led seminars, which are interspersed with self-study and group discussions without lecturer participation. Students are expected to actively participate in group discussions. The lecturer-led teaching sessions are compulsory and require both preparation and active participation in accordance with the instructions of the course lecturer.

If a student is absent from a teaching session for a valid reason, a written supplementary assignment is required according to the instructions of the course lecturer. Supplementation is allowed as an exception: if a student misses more than two teaching sessions, these sessions can be repeated the next time the course is offered.

Assessment

Assessment is by oral examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

Entry requirements

Admission to the course requires a bachelor's degree in history, history of ideas and science, or another subject with a historical focus.
