# Details of approval

# Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student shall be able to

## Knowledge and understanding

- describe what constitutes a defined and relevant research situation
- explain the importance of different types of literature in the construction of a research situation and in the dynamics of research debates.

## Competence and skills

- discuss different problem formulations in relation to a research situation
- critically and systematically synthesise knowledge from the humanities and social sciences from an international perspective
- demonstrate advanced skills in information search and source criticism
- apply AI as a tool in the research process

## Judgement and approach

- evaluate and problematise different approaches in relevant research areas
- identify need for additional knowledge
- make ethical judgements, including in relation to AI tools

## Course content

The course focuses on how research modes are identified, developed and used. During the course, students work on systematically summarising an international state of knowledge for a chosen theme and try out different ways of presenting their research review. In addition, the course deals with the importance of the state of research for the problem formulation of a study. The course also addresses the possible use of AI tools in the research process and emphasises ethical aspects of research work. The course is organised in close cooperation with the HT libraries.

## Course design

The teaching of the course is based on 2-4 lecturer-led seminars, which are interspersed with self-study and group discussions without lecturer participation. Students are expected to actively participate in group discussions. The lecturer-led teaching sessions are compulsory and require both preparation and active participation in accordance with the instructions of the course lecturer.

If a student is absent from a teaching session for a valid reason, a written supplementary assignment is required according to the instructions of the course lecturer. Supplementation is allowed as an exception: if a student misses more than three teaching sessions, these sessions can be repeated the next time the course is offered

#### Assessment

The course is assessed by two written assignments: a research review and a processorientated text reflecting on the development of the research review.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

#### Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

# Entry requirements

Admission to the course requires a bachelor's degree in history or the history of ideas and science, or another subject with a historical focus.
