ITAA03, Italian: Level 3, 30 credits Italienska: Fördjupningskurs, 30 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2011-05-11 and was last revised on 2023-03-13. The revised syllabus applies from 2023-03-15, autumn semester 2023.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a general degree at the first and second-cycle levels.

Language of instruction: Italian

Teaching is mainly conducted in Italian, but teaching in Swedish may occur.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- describe in Italian some of the most significant works and authors of Italian literature from the period 1200-1600,
- in Italian account for literary and linguistic theory and methods relevant for Italian as a subject,
- in Italian account for the contents and concepts in their chosen area of specialisation,

Competence and skills

- use Italian in speech and writing to critically analyse and report information
- analyse linguistic phenomena in Italian by means of linguistic theory and

methods

• use information technology resources in their work on the Italian language,

Judgement and approach

- discuss and assess the position of linguistics or literary theory in the academic community,
- identify their need for additional knowledge,
- assess information from different sources in Italian and make certain assessments on the type and quality of that information within their chosen area of specialisation,
- take a position on the general tradition of learning in the humanities

Course content

The course places major emphasis on oral and written proficiency and on the study and comprehension of texts in Italian from different periods in history. The two optional modules of the course aim partly to provide specialisation in Italian literature and culture, and to further strengthen language proficiency.

The course consists of three modules:

- 1. Specialisation in the Italian Language, 7.5 credits,
- 2. Text, History and Literary History, 7.5 credits,
- 3. Elective In-depth Course I, 7.5 credits,
- 4. Elective In-depth Course II, 7.5 credits.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures, group work, supervised self-study and supervision.

Module 2 contains three compulsory seminars. If the student cannot be present at these seminars, compensation is required by means of written assignments.

Assessment

Assessment of module 1 is based on a written exam and a written assignment; Assessment of module 2 is based on a written exam and an oral exam;

Module 3: is assessed through an oral exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

The grade of Pass on module 1 requires at least the grade Pass on both the written assignment and the written examination. The grade of Pass with distinction on module 1, requires the grade of Pass with distinction both on the written assignment

and on the written examination.

The grade of Pass on module 2 requires at least the grade of Pass on both the oral and the written examination. For the grade of Pass with distinction on module 2, the grade of Pass with distinction is required on both the oral and the written examination.

For the grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on at least 22.5 credits, of which 7.5 credits on module 1, and a grade of at least Pass on the remaining credits.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have completed the course ITAA02 or have obtained equivalent knowledge.

- The course is offered at the Centre for Languages and Literature, Lund University.
- Modules 1 and 2 are identical to equivalent modules on ITAK01 and ITAA05.
- The course is intended both for students specialising in education and for students with other specialisations.
- The number of credits allocated for course content that is shared in whole or in part with another course can only be credited once for a degree.
