Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2021-06-04 to be valid from 2021-06-04, spring semester 2022.

General Information

Subject: Italian

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Language of instruction: Swedish

Pinocchio can be studied in Italian, Swedish or English. Some components may be in English.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- account for the contents of Pinocchio
- account for the role of Pinocchio in the emergence of children's and young adult literature

Competence and skills

- orally analyse the contents of Pinocchio and the work's role in the emergence of children's and young adult literature
- analyse the contents of Pinocchio at a general level

Judgement and approach

- based on given frameworks, apply a comparative perspective to Pinocchio in Italian, European and Swedish contexts
- reflect on the role of children's books in the emergence of an official language and a nation state.

Course content

The course takes the Italian children's book Pinocchio as its starting point and covers two general themes: 1. The role of early children's books in the emergence of an official language and a nation state. 2. The link between early children's books and folktales. Pinocchio's role in Italian literary history is studied in relation to Swedish and European circumstances.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures and exercises (individually and in groups).

The course is offered as a distance learning course and makes use of an online learning platform and video conferencing program for teaching sessions and lectures. Students are required to participate under these conditions and to have access to a computer with an Internet connection. The department will provide information about the technical requirements.

Assessment

Assessment of the course is based on a final oral exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
