# ITAD02, Italian: Beginners' Course II, 15 credits Italienska, nybörjarkurs II - nätbaserad distanskurs, 15 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

# Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2011-04-13 and was last revised on 2023-03-13. The revised syllabus applies from 2023-03-15, autumn semester 2023.

## General Information

The course is offered as a stand-alone course. It can normally be included in a general qualification for both first and second-cycle studies.

# Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

#### Knowledge and understanding

- describe the central elements of the Italian language,
- describe, and put in context, at least one selected Italian literary text and one author,
- give an account of several cultural aspects of the Italian society such as national and local traditions and elements of everyday life,
- give an account of several geographic aspects of Italy such as its most important tourist locations and cities,
- give an account of several cultural-historical aspects of Italian society such such as Italian music and art,

## Competence and skills

- communicate in colloquial speech and writing in Italian,
- master a vocabulary consisting of the most frequent words in Italian,
- apply fundamental elements of Italian grammar,

## Judgement and approach

- identify their need for additional knowledge and skills in the subject
- compare certain traditions and circumstances in Italian society with those of Sweden.

#### Course content

In the course, vocabulary and grammatical structures in connection with the study of texts containing mainly cultural content that is somewhat more advanced than at the previous level. Furthermore, simple written exercises in Italian are included. Oral skills are practiced further, in particular in connection with the reading of texts about culture and society.

The course consists of three modules:

- 1. Grammar and written language proficiency, 7 credits,
- 2. Text, 4 credits,
- 3. Culture and oral language proficiency, 4 credits.

# Course design

The course is offered as a distance learning course with the support of a web-based learning platform and/or digital tools. Students are required to participate on this basis and to have access to a computer with an internet connection a web camera. The department will provide information about the technical requirements.

#### Assessment

Module 1, Grammar and written language proficiency are examined through digitally supervised written examination based on real-time streaming Module 2, Text, be examined through oral examination based on real-time streaming Module 3, Culture and oral language proficiency are examined through oral examination using real time streaming.

Camera monitoring takes place in real time. No recording takes place. Live monitoring is required in order to assess the student's knowledge without the student having access to any aids.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

#### Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For the grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on at least 11 credits and at least a grade of Pass on the remaining credits, of which 7 from Module 1.

## Entry requirements

Admission to the course requires Italian Stage 2 or ITAD01 (Italian, beginners' course 1) or equivalent knowledge.
