ITAD11, Italian: Beginner's Course 1 - Online Course, 10 credits

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2023-12-07 (U 2023/924). The syllabus comes into effect 2024-03-01 and is valid from the autumn semester 2024.

General information

The course is offered as a freestanding distance learning course. It can normally be included in a general qualification for both first and second-cycle studies.

Language of instruction: Swedish

Main field of study *Specialisation*

Italian G1N, First cycle, has only upper-secondary level entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- in Swedish, describe some basic features of the Italian language and its grammar,
- master a rudimentary Italian vocabulary
- account in Swedish for some of the most basic pronunciation principles of Italian,

Competence and skills

- apply basic elements of Italian grammar,
- participate in a prepared short, very simple conversation in Italian,
- master some of the most basic pronunciation principles of Italian,
- write simple sentences in Italian with the help of aids,
- read and understand simple texts in Italian with the help of bilingual dictionaries and relevant grammars.

Judgement and approach

- identify their own need for additional knowledge and skills in the subject.

Course content

The course is a beginners' course in Italian so no previous knowledge of the language is required. The course focuses on spoken and written Italian, and on Italian culture. The course consists of two modules: Module 1 (5 credits) and module 2 (5 credits). In module 1 and module 2, grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation, listening comprehension and basic written and oral communication in Italian are trained.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, group work and individual practical exercises.

The course is offered as a distance learning course with the support of a web-based learning platform and/or digital tools. Students are required to participate on this basis and to have access to a computer with an internet connection and a webcam. The department will provide information about technical requirements.

Assessment

Module 1 is examined through digitally supervised written examination using real-time streaming,

Module 2 is examined through an oral presentation online and a digitally monitored examination using real-time streaming.

Camera monitoring takes place in real time. No recording takes place. Monitoring in real time is required in order to be able to assess the student's knowledge without students having access to aids.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

For the grade of Pass, at least the grade Pass on all examination elements in modules 1 and 2 is required. For the grade of Pass with distinction, the grade Pass with distinction is required on the written examination parts in module 1 and 2.
