## ITAD12, Italian: Beginner's Course 2 - Online Course, 10 credits

*Italienska, nybörjarkurs 2 - nätbaserad distanskurs, 10 högskolepoäng*  
First Cycle / Grundnivå

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### Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2023-12-07 (U 2023/922). The syllabus comes into effect 2024-09-01 and is valid from the spring semester 2025.

### General information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a general qualification for both first and second-cycle studies.

### Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, students shall be able to

#### Knowledge and understanding

- in Swedish, describe some basic features of the Italian language and its grammar,
- master a vocabulary consisting of the most frequent words in Italian,
- in Italian, give an account of some features of Italian culture and social life,

#### Competence and skills

- apply basic parts of Italian grammar in speech and writing,

- write short, simple texts in Italian with the help of aids,
- read and understand short and simple texts in Italian with the help of bilingual dictionaries and relevant grammars,
- participate in a prepared short, simple conversation in Italian,
- master the pronunciation principles of Italian,
- understand most of an oral presentation in well articulated Italian on familiar topics,
- in Italian, discuss some cultural aspects of Italian society and some geographic aspects of Italy.

### **Judgement and approach**

- identify their own need for additional knowledge and skills in the subject.

### **Course content**

The course is an advanced course in new entrant Italian that builds upon ITAD11. The course focuses on spoken and written Italian, and on Italian culture. The course consists of the following two modules: Module 1 (5 credits) and module 2 (5 credits). In modules 1 and 2, grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation, listening comprehension and basic written and oral communication in Italian are trained.

### **Course design**

The course is based on lectures, group work and individual practical exercises. The course is offered entirely as a distance learning course, supported by an online virtual learning platform and digital tools. Students are required to participate on this basis and to have access to a computer with an internet connection and a webcam. The department will provide information about technical requirements.

### **Assessment**

Module 1 is examined through digitally supervised written examination using real-time streaming.

Module 2 is examined through an oral assignment and a camera-monitored examination using real-time streaming

Camera monitoring takes place in real time. No recording takes place. Monitoring in real time is required in order to be able to assess the student's knowledge without students having access to aids.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

### **Grades**

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

For the grade of Pass, at least the grade Pass on all examination elements in modules 1 and 2 is required. For the grade of Pass with distinction, the grade Pass with distinction is required on the written examination parts in module 1 and 2.

## Entry requirements

Admission to the course requires Italian Stage 1 or Italian ITAD11 (Italian, beginners' course 1) or equivalent knowledge.

- The course content corresponds to ITAC12 that is offered on campus.
- The number of credits allocated for course content that is shared in whole or in part with another course can only be credited once for a degree.
