Details of approval

The syllabus is an old version, approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2014-01-16 and was valid from 2014-01-16, spring semester 2014.

General Information

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at both the undergraduate and graduate levels.

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Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to describe some of the most influential works and authors from the 13th to 17th centuries in Italian literature,
- be able to demonstrate an awareness of the scholarly foundations of and methods used in the discipline of Italian,

Competence and skills

- be able to use spoken and written Italian to make critical analyses and give an account of information acquired,
- be able to, independently, formulate, resolve and give an account of a simple

This is a translation of the course syllabus approved in Swedish

- research assignment within a specified time-frame,
- be able to evaluate information from various sources and be able to assess, independently, the nature and quality of that information,
- be able to utilise resources made available by information technology to practise and study Italian,

Judgement and approach

- be able to discuss the place of linguistics in the academic world,
- demonstrate an ability for critical self-evaluation,
- make assessments informed by relevant disciplinary, social and ethical issues,
- be able to relate to a general humanist scholarly tradition.

Course content

The course places great emphasis on written and oral proficiency, and textual study and textual comprehension. In relation to the previous courses, the use of a scholarly method and approach is more highly pronounced. The course includes a degree project which is examined critically at a seminar.

The course consists of three sub-courses:

1. Advanced Course in Italian, 7.5 credits,
2. Textual Studies History and Literary History, 7.5 credits,
3. Degree Project, 15 credits.

Course design

Teaching takes the form of lectures and group work and supervision. All elements involving proficiency are obligatory.

Assessment

Examinations take the following forms:

1. Specialisation in the Italian language: Written examination and home assignments,
2. Text, history and the history of literature: Written examination, oral examination and home assignments,
3. Degree project: Paper, oral examination (opposition).

Passed degree projects at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for uploading the passed degree project as a PDF file in LUP student papers.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a Pass on the whole course the student shall have passed all sub-

courses. To be awarded a grade of Distinction on the whole course the student shall have achieved the grade of Distinction for at least 15 higher education credits on the course.

In Italian sub-courses the grades 1-5 are used in which 1 is the lowest and 5 the highest grade. A grade of 1 is equivalent to Fail.

Entry requirements

To be eligible for the course requires the successful completion of ITAA02 Italian, Level 2, or the equivalent.

2. The points allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
