Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2008-04-21 to be valid from 2008-04-21, autumn semester 2008.

General Information

The course is a compulsory component of the Master of Arts programme in Language and Linguistics specialising in Italian. It is also offered as a single course and can normally be included as part of a general degree at the undergraduate or graduate levels. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

Language of instruction: Italian
Some Swedish may be used.

Main field of studies

Italian

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to demonstrate in-depth knowledge and understanding of the literary history of the Italian language, its various periods and genres and key authors and works
- be able to demonstrate a familiarity with Italian literature of various styles and from various genres and periods.

Competence and skills

- be able to discuss issues autonomously taken from a selected problem area
- be able to summarise and give an account of a chosen problem area.

Judgement and approach

- be able to relate to a general humanist educational tradition and relate this to the literary history of the Italian language and to a selected problem area.

Course content

In consultation with the lecturer, students choose a selection of literature and a problem area to study in an in-depth manner, using knowledge gained in previous studies of Italian literature as a point of departure.

Course design

Teaching consists of seminars and supervised independent studies.

Assessment

Examinations are in oral and/or written form, according to an agreement reached between the lecturer and the student.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be eligible for the course requires the successful completion of 90 higher education credits in Italian, or the equivalent.
