Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2010-06-24 to be valid from 2010-06-24, autumn semester 2010.

General Information

The course is offered as a free-standing course and can normally be included as part of a first- or second-cycle degree. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

Language of instruction: English, Japanese and Swedish

Main field of studies

Japanese

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements

G2F, First cycle, has at least 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to demonstrate specialised understanding of already acquired knowledge of the syntax, pronunciation and writing system of Japanese
- be able to account for practically acquired knowledge of the different registers of spoken and written Japanese, including the differences between everyday language and formal and informal professional language, especially with regard to respectful language
- be able to demonstrate specialised knowledge of the cultural, political and economic circumstances of present-day Japan
- be able to reflect on work in the country of the target language and the professional routines at a Swedish agency or company abroad

Competence and skills

- be able to use a rich and varied vocabulary in the relevant work placement
- be able to communicate in Japanese, without aids, about the area of activity at the work placement
- be able to master Japanese in authentic situations at the work placement

Judgement and approach

- be able to place Japanese society in perspective and compare it with Swedish society
- be able to reflect critically on the experiences of the work placement and analyse the role of previous studies for practical work.

Course content

The course consists of a work placement at a Swedish agency or company in Japan. During the placement, the student will gain practical experience of the use of Japanese at a Swedish workplace in Japan.

Course design

The course consists of a full-time work placement lasting no less than 20 weeks at a Swedish agency or company in Japan.

Assessment

On completion of the work placement, students shall submit a report on how the learning outcomes of the course have been fulfilled. A certificate from the agency/company on the nature, scope and length of the placement shall be attached to the report.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course students must have passed the course JAPA21 or the equivalent.

Further information

1. Students arrange work placements themselves. The work placement must be approved by the undergraduate studies board before it can be commenced.
2. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
