# Details of approval

The course is offered as a freestanding course.

It can be selected as a specialisation course in the Bachelor's programme in Religious Studies and Theology.

It can be included in a first or second cycle degree.

## Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

#### Knowledge and understanding

- account for the historical development of Zionism and the state of Israel
- account for the most important ideologues and ideologies of Zionism up to 1948
- account for the background of the appearance and importance of Zionism within and outside present-day Israel,

#### Competence and skills

- analyse and interpret a selection of pre-1948 Zionist texts
- analyse and compare different forms of Zionist ideology as well as the relationship between these forms and their historical, social and religious context
- with a certain degree of independence highlight and critically reflect on the relationship between different Zionist ideologies and Israeli policy from the establishment of the state of Israel to today,

## Judgement and approach

• informed by a power and ethnicity perspective, assess the importance of a national native country to the identity of an imagined community

#### Course content

The course deals with Zionism and the state of Israel from the perspectives of both history and the history of ideas.

Against the background of the historical emergence of Zionism, texts written by major representatives of the diffeent Zionist ideologies are discussed and placed in perspective, focusing on the specific characteristics of each ideologue.

Furthermore, the course addresses the religious, political and historical context of the Jewish and Zionist presence in Mandatory Palestine and the first 60 years of the state of Israel.

Among other topics discussed are the connection between Zionism and Jewish identity and the different ways in which Zionism has put its stamp on Jewish history and Israeli policy.

# Course design

The course is mainly a distance learning course supported by a web-based learning platform and digital tools. Students are required to participate on these conditions and to have access to a computer with internet connection, a headset (microphone and ear phones) and preferably a camera. Information regarding technical requirements is available from the department

The teaching consists of web-based lectures and five compulsory web-based text seminars. Students are expected to participate actively in the web-based seminars.

#### Assessment

The assessment is continuous and based on an Internet-based repetition exercise, eight written assignments and active participation in the course blog and the web-based text seminars.

#### Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

# Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have 60 credits including 15 credits in Jewish Studies.
