Details of approval

The syllabus is an old version, approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2015-12-01 and was valid from 2016-01-18, spring semester 2016.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can be included in a Bachelor's or Master's degree.

History of Religions

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- provide an account of the formulation of male and female gender roles within Judaism in different historical, ritual and religious contexts
- provide a comparative description of male and female gender roles within the different religious branches of Judaism

Competence and skills

- write an essay discussing the construction of female and male gender roles

Judgement and approach

- use issues of power, sex and ethnicity to take a position on how the view of masculinity and femininity has affected Jewish tradition and culture.

Course content

The course deals with the construction of male and female gender roles within Judaism during different historical periods and in different ritual and religious contexts, and to what extent stock religious ideas and myths impact on the Jewish conception of masculinity and femininity.

Course design

The teaching consists of online lectures and webinars.

The course is a distance learning course supported by an online learning platform and digital tools. It presupposes that students who enrol on the course understand these conditions and have access to a computer with internet connections and a headset (microphone and headphones) and preferably web camera. The department provides information about the technical requirements.

Assessment

The assessment is continuous and based on five essays of 2-3 pages and two compulsory blog posts.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have 30 credits within the humanities, social sciences or law.
