General Information

Subject: Chinese

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Language of instruction: English, Swedish and Chinese

Main field of studies

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for fundamental methods and tools of relevance to the learning of Chinese
- identify and describe different methods of subject didactics
- account for the most common syntactic errors at Swedish students of Chinese
- account for the most common pronunciation errors of Swedish students of Chinese

Competence and skills

- reflect at a basic level on a teaching situation in Chinese
- identify and correct at a basic level the most common syntactic errors of Swedish students of Chinese
- identify and correct at a basic level the most common pronunciation errors of Swedish students of Chinese

Judgement and approach

- reflect on cultural differences and similarities as they are manifested in source and target languages
- reflect on their development in the teaching of Standard Chinese and identify their need of further knowledge

Course content

The course consists of online lectures on didactic theories and methods, followed by online seminars and exercises aiming to introduce or support the students in the profession as teachers of Standard Chinese. It deals with commonly occurring problems in the teaching of young beginners. One such problem is to be analysed in an assessed paper that is to be discussed at the concluding seminars.

Course design

The course is offered entirely as a distance learning course and makes use of an online learning platform and digital tools. Students are required to participate under these conditions, and to have access to a computer with an Internet connection and a headset. The department will provide information about the technical requirements. The teaching consists of online lectures, group exercises and seminars, 2-3 of which are compulsory.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a written (take-home) exam and a written assignment (a minor paper).

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on the exam and written assignment. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded the grade of Pass on the written exam and the grade of Pass with Distinction on the written assignment.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed KINC11, Chinese: Beginners' Course or KINC02, Chinese: Beginners' Course B, KINC22, Chinese: Beginners' Course B or the equivalent.
