Details of approval

General Information

The course is as an elective course in the Master's programme in Cognitive Science (HAKOG).

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- account for advanced knowledge in one of the areas of cognitive science
- understand and define concepts in the area of specialisation

Competence and skills

- select an issue, conceptual apparatus and description level in the area
- participate in research and development in the area of specialisation

Judgement and approach

- apply a reflective and critical approach to their own knowledge in the area of specialisation and that of others
- identify their need for additional knowledge.

Course content

The course provides in-depth knowledge and skills in one of the areas of cognitive science, for example eye tracking, programming, experimental design, ERP methods, language and communication or visual language.

The area of specialisation and specific contents are chosen in consultation with the examiner of the course.

Course design

The course can be selected from the regular range of courses offered or from other courses within or outside Lund University with a relevant specialisation in cognitive science. The course is carried out in accordance with the chosen area of specialisation, and may consist of lectures, seminars and exercises as well as independent work. The course may contain compulsory components.

Assessment

The assessment of the course is based on one or more written assignments or a written examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have completed KOGM01 or the equivalent.
