Learning outcomes

The aim is to prepare artists in defining and formulating a research project in fine arts, aiming for admission to a doctoral programme in fine arts. The purpose is to strengthen and develop the students artistic work and research project through individual supervision, methodology and seminars.

Knowledge and understanding

The focus is on the individual research project that the applicant applied to the programme with and develops during the programme. Based on this project, students are encouraged to develop research questions that emerge from individual research processes and artistic methods. These are discussed and developed in relation to other methods that have emerged from other relevant research fields in close collaboration with existing academic disciplines.

Competence and skills

Through this training, students are stimulated to develop their own methods, which are different to those applied in other fields of research.

Course content

The course manifests through individual tutorials and studio visits, –individual preparation for artistic research.

Further and intimately connected to that, a major series of seminars is coordinated and conducted by the individual students of the MFAAR2 to gain the specialisation required to conduct research on a high international level, here explicitly being trained to develop, stage and document discourse (–as well as to connect to fellow–fellow researchers close to one’s interests–) from within one’s own field. The MFAAR1 student/s will be integrated in the MFAAR2 seminars as participant yet not conducting their own session.

Further and importantly, the student/s will join Gertrud Sandqvist’s class Analyzing Your Own Work.

For the MFAAR1; the fall semester sets the very ground for preparing for individual artistic research. Besides individual tutorials and studio visit, the MFAAR1 student/s participates in the MFAAR2 seminar series without conducting their own session. This participation is most fruitful to get insight in more developed MFAAR projects and studies, hence providing an intimate opportunity to learn from the other students and get inspired by them (and also challenged!) as they get closer to PhD research. The process of shaping up one’s own artistic research is singular by nature, and possibilities to get a glimpse of how other artists researchers–a younger generation that is–go about it, can support the MFAAR1’s own processing of ‘visual thinking’ in profound and nourishing ways.

In addition, the MFAAR1 will join Gertrud Sandqvist’s class for the MFA2-group, Analyzing Your Own Work, which confronts the student/s with reflecting upon their own work via others.

The overall aim of this course is to set the ground and manifest a profound individual capacity to undertake Artistic Research on the level of a PhD, through discourse and its articulations into ‘A Form’ –including the research proposal, and artistic project.

Course design

The educational form will be individual tutorials and studio visits, participation in seminars (conducted by the MFAAR2), and a class by Gertrud Sandqvist.

Individual tutorials and studio visits will be set as agreed with each student throughout fall. Starting off with a major tutorial at the beginning of the semester.

Seminar dates will be confirmed according to the guest speakers’ availabilities.

Assessment

For the grade pass the student needs to be at least 80% present at lectures and seminars and receive the grade pass on tasks, if any.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
