Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by Committee for Biomedical, Medical and Public Health Education on 2015-05-27 to be valid from 2015-05-27, autumn semester 2015.

General Information

The course is a compulsory component of semester 5 of the Master of Science programme in Medicine.

Language of instruction: Swedish

Learning outcomes

Competence and skills

On completion of the course, student shall be able to:

- conduct an initial consultation with a patient, deriving the medical history of the patient as well as the patient?s own view of the nature of the problem
- adapt the approach to the patient to the individual predisposition of the patient
- conduct an initial physiological examination while maintaining good rapport with the patient and respecting his or her personal integrity
- initiate record-keeping while taking current regulations into account
- consider how gender and ethnicity affect the view of health and illness

Judgement and approach

On completion of the course, students shall be able to:

- reflect on their own professional development
- behave in a respectful and professional manner towards patients, healthcare staff, fellow students and lecturers

Course content

The course is taught alongside Pathobiology II in semester 5. During the course, students are provided with knowledge, skills and approaches that further develop their ability to deal with patients in a professional fashion. Subjects examined

Portfolio consisting of

- documented attendance at compulsory components
- assessments of clinical tests of skills in consultation and physiological examination
- reflection on individual professional development

Course design

1. Lectures, group exercises, clinical practice. All scheduled tuition, except lectures, is compulsory.

2. The course is examined through a review of the student?s portfolio conducted with a lecturer. In order to be assessed, students must have passed Professional Development 1-4.

Assessment

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass. Students are awarded one of the grades Pass or Fail.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed

examinations up to and including semester 2 of the medical degree programme and passed course components up to and including semester 4.
