## **LATM04, Latin: Level 4 - Mag. Course, 30 credits**

*Latin: Magisterkurs, 30 högskolepoäng*

Second Cycle / Avancerad nivå

### **Details of approval**

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2007-05-23 to be valid from 2007-05-23, autumn semester 2007.

### **General Information**

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at the undergraduate or graduate levels.

*Language of instruction:* Swedish

*Main field of studies*

Latin

*Depth of study relative to the degree requirements*

A1E, Second cycle, contains degree project for Master of Arts/Master of Science (60 credits)

### **Learning outcomes**

On completion of the course the student shall

#### **Knowledge and understanding**

- be able to demonstrate broad knowledge of Latin literature and literary history
- be able to demonstrate familiarity with linguistic theories, methods and approaches found within his/her chosen area of specialisation

#### **Competence and skills**

- be able to read and understand Latin texts, including poetry, which vary greatly in content and language
- be able to assess, summarise and evaluate information from various sources

- be able to formulate, resolve and report research findings from his/her chosen area of specialisation within either Latin linguistics or culture within a given timeframe, autonomously and using suitable scholarly terminology

### **Judgement and approach**

- be able to discuss and evaluate the place of linguistics and cultural studies in the academic world
- demonstrate a sound ability for self-evaluation and be able to assess what is involved in the roles of cultural encounters, various ethnicities and gender
- be able to relate to a general humanist tradition of learning.

### **Course content**

The course provides the students with in-depth knowledge and understanding of Latin prose and poetry as well as an insight into a scholarly area of specialisation. In addition, scholarly writing is practiced. The course includes writing a degree thesis which is then discussed and defended at a seminar. Language proficiency is practiced throughout the course.

The course consists of the following sub-courses:

1. Textual Studies, 15 credits,
2. Degree Thesis, 15 credits.

### **Course design**

Teaching consists of tutoring, seminars and group exercises.

### **Assessment**

The following examination forms may occur: written tests, oral tests and submitted assignments. In addition, a seminar is held in which the student's own degree thesis is discussed as is that of another student. Performance in this seminar contributes to the final grade.

Passed degree projects at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for uploading the passed degree project as a PDF file in LUP student papers.

### **Grades**

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a Pass on the whole course the student shall have the grade of Pass on all sub-courses. To be awarded the grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course the student shall have the grade of Pass with Distinction on at least 15 of the credits on the course and a grade of Pass on the remaining credits.

## **Entry requirements**

To be eligible for the course requires the successful completion of LAT503, Latin, B.A. Course, or the equivalent.

## **Further information**

1. The course replaces LAT504.
2. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
