LATM10, Latin: Ancient Prose and Poetry, 15 credits Latin: Antik prosa och poesi, 15 högskolepoäng Second Cycle / Avancerad nivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2008-04-21 to be valid from 2008-04-21, autumn semester 2008.

General Information

The course is a compulsory component of the Master of Arts programme in Language and Linguistics specialising in Latin. The course is offered as a single course and can normally be included as part of a general degree at the undergraduate or graduate levels. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

Language of instruction: English

The course can be taught in Swedish if an agreement is reached by both the teacher and the students. Such an agreement would depend on both the lecturer and the students having a good knowledge of Swedish.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to demonstrate in-depth knowledge and understanding of classical Latin literature and literary history
- be able to give an account of and discuss the historical development of the Latin language in Antiquity

• be able to demonstrate familiarity with theories and methods pertaining to linguistics, the humanities or philology.

Competence and skills

- demonstrate an ability to understand classical Latin texts, both prose and poetry, which vary greatly in content and language
- be able to assess, summarise and evaluate critically information from various sources.

Judgement and approach

• be able to relate to a general humanist educational tradition and its connection to the cultural heritage of Antiquity.

Course content

The course provides the students with in-depth knowledge and understanding of classical Latin prose and poetry through the reading of annotated editions of representative texts. In addition, in-depth studies of philological theory and method are included.

Course design

Teaching consists of seminars and supervised independent studies.

Assessment

Examinations are oral and/or written, according to an agreement reached between the lecturer and the student.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be eligible for the course requires the successful completion of LATK01, or the equivalent.
