# LINN19, Linguistics: Language, Culture and Mind, 7.5 credits

## Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2012-10-10 to be valid from 2012-10-10, spring semester 2013.

#### General Information

The course is offered as an elective component of the MA programme in Language and Linguistics (HASPV). It is also offered as a free-standing course and can be included as part of a first- or second-cycle degree.

# Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

#### Knowledge and understanding

- be able to account for the impact of cultural and cognitive processes on language and linguistic structure
- be able to account for the interdisciplinary context of linguistics in the area of language studies
- be able to account for the key aspects of culturally imposed language variation
- be able to account for the way in which linguistics is linked theoretically and methodologically to other disciplines and research areas

### Competence and skills

- be able to apply concepts and methods of linguistics to other language disciplines in the area of language variation
- be able to link data on linguistic and cultural variation to theoretical perspectives in linguistics

### Judgement and approach

• be able to assess data on language variation in the light of theories in cognitive science and cultural linguistics.

#### Course content

The course deals with how language and language variation is determined by human cognition and culture with a focus on cultural and linguistic differences that are results of constrained variation.

## Course design

Teaching consists of lectures and 3-6 reports.

#### Assessment

The assessment is based on 3-6 oral reports and one written assignment (10 pages). Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

#### Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

# Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course students must have English B from Swedish upper secondary school or the equivalent and 90 credits including 60 credits in a language subject or Linguistics (General Linguistics or Phonetics) or the equivalent.
