Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2017-09-18 and was last revised on 2025-09-08 by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology (U 2025/645). The revised syllabus comes into effect 2025-09-09 and is valid from the spring semester 2026.

General information

Subject: Comparative Literature

The course is offered as a freestanding course. The course can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Language of instruction: Swedish

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for key currents and works in present-day poetry,
- communicate a certain understanding of literature with relevance to the course,

Competence and skills

- analyse and interpret present-day poetic texts and performances with the support of basic terms and concepts,
- discuss, and write and make oral presentations about poetry,
- independently identify, formulate and discuss issues using a basic scholarly approach to literature,

Judgement and approach

- judge and assess interpretations of different poetic works,
- identify their own need of further knowledge and expertise.

Course content

The course deals with the different venues of poetry and introduces concepts and perspectives of literary criticism that are relevant for the study of present-day poetry.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, exercises and discussion seminars. Attendance is compulsory in at least 75% of the sessions.

Assessment

The assessment is based on three assessed seminars and a written assignment.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction
For a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this
grade for all assessed components. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole
course, the student must also have been awarded this grade for the written
assignment.
