# LIVB40, Literary Practices II: Project, 15 credits

Litterära praktiker II: Projektarbete, 15 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

# Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2023-09-11 (U 2023/616). The syllabus comes into effect 2024-09-01 and is valid from the spring semester 2025.

## General information

The course is compulsory within the Bachelor's Programme in Comparative Literature. The course can be included in a general qualification for both first and second-cycle studies.

## Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, students shall be able to

#### Knowledge and understanding

- give an account of the practical, material and economic conditions of literature,
- give an account of stakeholders in the Swedish literary field,

#### Competence and skills

- make use of literary criticism skills in different practical working life contexts,
- independently develop and run feasible projects in the field of the literature,
- independently identify, plan and carry out a project considering the economic and material conditions of literature,

#### Judgement and approach

- evaluate the feasibility of their own project,
- evaluate the importance of their own project for, and dependence on, other stakeholders.

#### Course content

The course gives practical skills and insights in the conditions to identify, plan and carry out a project in the field of the literature mainly in relation to the Literary genres, processes and practices that are covered during the course Literary Practices I.

## Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, two compulsory seminars with group work. Additionally, a project is carried out, individually or in groups, under supervision. Participation in two to three supervision sessions is compulsory.

If, due to circumstances beyond their control, such as accidents, sudden illness or similar, students are unable to carry out a the ompulsory component, the University is responsible for ensuring that an equivalent alternative or another time for the component is offered. This also applies to students participating in activities in an elected position as a student representative.

#### Assessment

The course is examined through a project plan (2.5 credits), a project product (10 credits) and a reflective project description (2.5 credits).

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

## Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction For the grade of Pass on the whole course at least the grade Pass is required on all of the three examining assignments of the course. To be awarded a grade Pass on the whole course, students must have been awarded this grade on 10 credits.

## Entry requirements

Admission to the course requires a Pass grade on LIVB30 or an equivalent discipline.
