LIVK10, Comparative Literature: Level 3 - Bachelor Course, 30 credits

Litteraturvetenskap: Kandidatkurs, 30 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2008-03-27 and was last revised on 2025-09-08 by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology (U 2025/436). The revised syllabus comes into effect 2025-09-15 and is valid from the spring semester 2026.

General information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second-cycle qualification.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- at an advanced level, give an account of issues in literary studies
- at an advanced level, give an account of selected parts of the history of literature
- at an advanced level, give an account of research in literary studies and methods in literary studies

• give an account of advanced current research information relating to literary studies

Competence and skills

- at an advanced level, analyse and interpret literature
- implement and critically discuss theories and methods used in literary studies in an academic text
- carry out a number of independent assignments in which literary texts are reviewed, discussed and analysed
- implement knowledge of literary studies and the history of literature in an academic paper on literary studies and relate in a scientific way to sources and literature
- formulate a relevant problem in literary studies and carry out assignments within given timeframes
- at an advanced level give an account of and discuss, orally and in writing, information, problems and solutions in the field of literary studies,

Judgement and approach

- evaluate and critically examine sources and literature from a scholarly prespective,
- critically discuss issues concerning the background to theories in literary studies and the humanities relating to different views on people and society,
- relate to the role of knowledge in society and people's responsibility for how it is used,
- identify their need for further knowledge and expertise.

Course content

The course provides an advanced insight into the basic theoretical and methodological problems of literary studies using application exercises on literary texts. The course then focuses on the thematic study of material from the perspective of literary studies. The theme is established before the start of the course and could, for example, be authorship-oriented or relate to problems of a literary-sociological or genre nature. The students complete the course by executing an independent degree project with a scholarly orientation. The degree project is normally composed individually, but if the students wish, it can also be composed in pairs, with the supervisor's approval.

The course consists of the following modules:

- 1. Application of Literary Theories and Methods, 7.5 credits
- 2. Thematic Specialisation, 7.5 credits,
- 3. Degree Project, 15 credits.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, teaching sessions, exercises, discussion seminars and supervision. Supervision is normally limited to the semester when the student was first registered for the course. Exceptions can be made if there are special grounds.

Two compulsory, assessed seminars occur in Module 1. During Module 2, participation in at least 75% of the teaching components is compulsory.

If, due to circumstances beyond their control, such as accidents, sudden illness or similar, students are unable to carry out a compulsory component, the University is responsible for ensuring that an equivalent alternative or another time for the component is offered. This also applies to students participating in activities in an elected position as a student representative.

Assessment

Module 1 is assessed on the basis of an academic paper.

Module 2 is assessed on the basis of written work and oral presentation.

Module 3 is assessed on the basis of a degree project. The degree project is defended orally at a seminar. The assessment is also based on the student's critical review of a fellow student's degree project.

Degree projects awarded a grade of Pass at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for ensuring that the version of the degree project that has been assessed and approved is the one uploaded to LUP Student Papers (in PDF format).

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction For the grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade for all modules. For the grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must, in addition, have been awarded this grade on the degree project.

Entry requirements

General entry requirements and LIVA14, Comparative Literature: Level 1 and 2 (60 credits), or equivalent.
