LIVR26, Literature-Culture-Media: Spanish Literature including the Golden Age, 15 credits

Details of approval

The syllabus is an old version, approved by the pro-dean for first-cycle studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2016-06-22 and was valid from 2016-06-22, autumn semester 2016.

General Information

The course is included as an elective component of the MA in Literature-Culture-Media. It is also offered as a freestanding course and can be included in a second cycle degree.

The course is normally taught in Spanish, but can also be taught in Swedish or English,

provided there is a special agreement between the lecturer/s and the students. Such an agreement requires that all lecturers and all students are proficient in Swedish or English.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account both in general and in detail for the Golden Age of Spanish literature
- provide a specialised description of Spanish cultural life during the Golden Age
- account for Spanish Golden Age literature from the perspectives of both history and literary theory

Competence and skills

- account for Spanish Golden Age literature in its historical context
- account for the importance of the Golden Age for Spanish culture and identity
- apply and critically review the available handbooks and methodological tools for learning how to analyse and interpret texts

Judgement and approach

• identify and critically evaluate the themes and types of Spanish literature in relation to the cultural and political situation in Spain during the Golden Age

Course content

The course mainly deals with Golden Age texts that have made a major impression on Spanish literature, primarily prose but also poetry and drama. Among the works studied in the course are *Don Quijote* and *Lazarillo de Tormes*.

Course design

The course includes lectures and group exercises. Attendance is compulsory in all components.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a final written assignment and an oral exam.

The examiner may deviate from the regular form of examination if the student has been granted an alternative form of examination by the Disability Support Services, and if it complies with the learning outcomes of the course.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have completed Spanish Level 3 specialising in literature, or the equivalent.
