MUHA51, Interpretation - Main Instrument, 3 credits Interpretation - Huvudinstrument, 3 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by Education Committee for Music Teacher Education on 2022-11-23 to be valid from 2022-11-23, autumn semester 2023.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course for exchange students studying on the upper-secondary teacher training programme in Music.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, students are to be able to:

- precisely and independently interpret and perform repertoires on their main instrument
- make conscious choices regarding artistic expression

Course content

- Instrumental studies on a main instrument
- Rehearsals and interpretation

Course design

The implementation of the course requires the student's participation in all components of teaching.

Instruction takes place mainly during individual teaching sessions, in which practical

music-making is integrated with the student's reflections on their practice, rehearsals and development. The student is given choice over specialisation in, and breadth of, their own studies.

Assessment

The learning outcomes are assessed through performances in chosen teaching sessions/interim presentations and the student's oral reflections around the process of rehearsing. The timing of these components is decided in consultation between the lecturer and the student. A combined assessment of the student's attainment of the learning outcomes takes place at the end of the course.

The number of examinations is limited to five.

The course includes opportunities for assessment at a first examination, a reexamination close to the first examination and three further re-sit opportunities for courses completed in the past year (catch-up exam).

If a student with disabilities requires an equivalent examination alternative, this must be requested by the student no later than two weeks before the examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have been admitted onto the teacher training in Music at their home university and passed auditions for exchange studies at Malmö Academy of Music.

Further information

Course evaluation

The course evaluation includes formative (oral) evaluation where results can directly influence ongoing teaching and lead to discussions on learning between teachers and students, as well as a written evaluation that is carried out anonymously on completion of the course. The results of the written evaluation are to be made available to the students. The focus is on learning outcomes, contents and types of instruction. Important views and experiences from the course evaluations are passed on at the end of the course. The teachers are responsible for ensuring that the evaluations are carried out. Experiences and views from the evaluation shall be considered and followed up in the following year's course.
