Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by Education Committee for Music Teacher Education on 2022-11-23. The syllabus comes into effect 2022-11-23 and is valid from the autumn semester 2023.

General information

The course is offered as a freestanding course for exchange students studying on the upper-secondary teacher training programme in Music.

Language of instruction: English

Main field of study *Specialisation*

Music G2F, First cycle, has at least 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, students are to be able to:

- by ear, make folk and world music in an ensemble at a basic level
- in an ensemble, interpret and perform a folk and world music repertoire
- perform genre-specific features of playing in the folk and world music tradition at a basic level

Course content

- Pitch-based ensemble playing
- Folk and world music repertoire
- Own rehearsal studies of repertoire on the basis of recordings and other digital material

- Arrangement for ensemble in folk and world music traditions

Course design

The implementation of the course requires the student's participation in all components of teaching. The teaching is given individually via a virtual learning environment and in groups in the form of a number of half-day meetings. Performances and presentations take place in selected lectures or concerts.

Assessment

The intended learning outcomes are examined through a performance at the end of the course and two interim presentations during the course. The timing of these presentations is decided in consultation between teacher and the student group.

The number of examinations is limited to five.

The course includes opportunities for assessment at a first examination, a re-examination close to the first examination and three further re-sit opportunities for courses completed in the past year (catch-up exam).

If a student with disabilities requires an equivalent examination alternative, this must be requested by the student no later than two weeks before the examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have been admitted onto the teacher training in Music or a Master's Programme in Music at their home university and passed auditions for exchange studies at Malmö Academy of Music.

Further information

Course evaluation

The course evaluation includes formative (oral) evaluation, the results of which can directly influence ongoing teaching and lead to discussions on learning between teachers and students, as well as a written evaluation that is carried out anonymously on completion of the course. The results of the written evaluation are to be made available to the students. The focus is on learning outcomes, contents and types of instruction. Important views and experiences from the course evaluations are passed on at the end of the course. The teachers are responsible for ensuring that the evaluations are carried out. Experiences and views from the evaluation shall be considered and followed up in the following year's course.
