The syllabus was approved by Education Committee of the Performane and Church Music Department on 2018-06-13 to be valid from 2019-01-01, spring semester 2019.

Compulsory course in Bachelor's Programme in Church Music: first cycle 180 credits.

Learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to enable students to acquire the following knowledge and skills on completion of the course.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

- show good direction towards a developed ability for improvisation,
- show good direction towards a developed ability for liturgical organ playing and

- when improvising, show good direction towards a developed understanding of the style and expressions of the used improvisation models.

Competence and skills

The student shall on completion of the course

- show good direction towards the ability to critically reflect on the personal artistic approach and
- show good direction towards the ability to independently study and carry out artistic assignments.

Judgement and approach

The student shall on completion of the course

- show good direction towards the ability to have a constructive dialogue with other artists.

Course content

Study of mass music and hymns from different communities as well as work with bound and free improvisation based on different improvisation models. The course assumes approved result of earlier course MUKY14.

Course design

The course is carried out in the form of individual lessons, group lessons, seminars, guest lectures, workshops/master classes and individual work (practicing, preparations).

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and tests. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

The course grade relates to the fulfillment of the learning outcomes of the course.

Fail means insufficient fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

Pass means sufficient fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

Pass with distinction means good and in-depth fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

The course grading is done through the qualitative weighing of the fulfillment of the individual course learning outcomes.
